David Hernandez is the recipient of a 2011 NEA Literature Fellowship in Poetry. His recent collection, *Hoodwinked*, won the Kathryn A. Morton Prize and is now available from Sarabande Books. His other collections include *Always Danger* (SIU Press, 2006), winner of the Crab Orchard Series in Poetry, and *A House Waiting for Music* (Tupelo Press, 2003). His poems have appeared in *FIELD*, *Ploughshares*, *The Threepenny Review*, *The Missouri Review*, *TriQuarterly*, *The Southern Review*, and *Poetry Daily*. He is also the author of two YA novels, *No More Us for You* and *Suckerpunch*, both published by HarperCollins.

The program brings a local creative writer to the department where students can learn about writing from a practicing writer.
